Dear Alumni,

Greetings once again from your alma mater. Our alumni are now making a point to meet and greet wherever possible. Our get-together at Sumul, Mumbai and Patna are the examples of that. This helps to strengthen our bond and build a family feeling. I urge to organize such events as much as you can. At the college, maintaining our tradition, we completed 100% placement of our graduates (57) and post graduates (19). Fifteen cooperative and private dairies/ organizations conducted campus interviews at the college which included prominent organizations like Tetra Pak, GCMMF, Amulfed Dairy, Adare Foods, etc. The average salary for bachelor students is ₹ 4.7 lakh per annum and for post graduate students is ₹ 6.25 lakh per annum. The highest salary received by 4 post graduate students was ₹8.7 lakh.

We have received a new batch of B.Tech. students just now. The intake capacity has gone up to 72 after addition of 10% seats for economically weaker sections. SMC has remained the first choice for securing admissions, and you will be happy to know that from among the 2300 applicants of 'A' group students, we got the top class students. The top student has 93% merit marks and the cut off in general category is 73.5%.

On the research front, the faculty has given 10 recommendations on new products or process optimization for dairy/food industry and entrepreneurs. Our students and faculty has excelled in many extra-curricular activities. We organized an Industry interface meet for the first time to appraise the industry about our research recommendations. This will definitely strengthen our relations with industry. We also organized a program for school children to bring awareness about the health benefits of probiotic foods. This event is also increasing our visibility to school children who are our potential students for dairy technology degree. The interest further increased as we have initiated an integrated program on PGDDM in collaboration with IRMA.

Many of our alumni have progressed in profession and have achieved higher positions. However, many of them are not communicating with us. I request all the alumni to notify us, all the achievements as soon as possible. Your alma mater will be very happy to get such news and will feel proud for you. Shri Meensh Shah has reached the post of Executive Director of National Dairy Development Board and it is really a matter for pride for all of us. I wish all of you very bright professional and social life.

The meet was jointly organized by Faculty of Dairy Science and Faculty of Food Processing Technology. Around 75 technical persons and policy makers from dairy and food industry as well as small and medium business holders and entrepreneurs mainly from Gujarat and other States participated in this event.



In the inaugural session, the Principal and Dean of Faculty of Dairy Science, Dr. J.B. Prajapati, in his inaugural speech welcomed all the participants and gave a brief background and achievements of both the faculties. Dr. R.F. Sutar, the In-charge Dean, College of Food Processing Technology & Bioenergy spoke about the range of products, processes and equipment developed by both the faculties. Dr. K.B. Kathiria, Director of Research and Dean Post Graduate Studies, AAU, in his speech said that the University has completed a good number of research projects in both the faculties. The technologies and equipment developed by AAU has been published in the form of a booklet. Further, he added that University has a Business Planning and Development (BPD) unit deciding the terms and conditions for technology transfer. Dr A.K. Makwana, the organizing secretary of the event, proposed vote of thanks. Dr. N.C. Patel, the Hon. Vice Chancellor of the University, highlighted the point that during the last few years the scientists of both the faculties have carried out intensive research and released several recommendations related to new product technologies, process upgradation, new equipment and tools, etc. and the main aim of this meet was to take the University's research output to its real users. He added that the University intends to popularize all its research recommendations among maximum possible beneficiaries and indicated that the University will continue to organize such events in future also.

Inauguration was followed by presentation of technologies by the Faculty of Dairy Science. Total 36 technologies/process/novel products were presented. After this, the Faculty of Food Processing Technology made presentations. Cryogenic grinding technology was presented for extraction of principal compounds from spices. Several new products, equipment and implements developed were also presented. Most of the products developed by the faculty were given for sensory evaluation to the participants and a few were presented as exhibits. The booklet containing information regarding new developed technologies, products and processes were given to the participants. Later on, the participants were taken for visit to different laboratories, pilot plants and research infrastructure of both the faculties.

Probiotic Awareness Day – a contest for School Children

SMC College of Dairy Science, Anand Agricultural University in association with Gut Microbiota and Probiotic Science Foundation, India and SASANET-Fermented foods organised **"PROBIOTIC AWARENESS DAY"**- An awareness programme and contest for school children on 29th June, 2019.

The programme aimed at increasing awareness among school children about probiotics, their health benefits and probiotic foods. The contest in the form of oral presentation was on "Role of Probiotics or Friendly bacteria in Human Health". Twenty two schools from Anand and nearby places enthusiastically participated in the event.





Dr. J.B. Prajapati, Principal & Dean in his welcome address said that he was highly overwhelmed by the performance of the students. He defined probiotics as live microorganisms which when administered in adequate amounts confers health benefit to the host. He clarified that all beneficial bacteria are not probiotic. Also probiotics are specific strains of microbes which have atleast one clinically proven health benefit. He also spoke on initiative taken by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) along with the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) to formulate guidelines for regulation of probiotic products in the country. These guidelines define a set of parameters required for a product/strain to be termed as 'probiotic' which include identification of the strain, in vitro screening for probiotic characteristics, animal studies to establish safety and in vivo animal and human studies to establish efficacy. The guidelines also include requirements for labelling of the probiotic products with strain specification, viable numbers at the end of shelf life, storage conditions, etc., which would be helpful to the consumers to safeguard their own interest.

Dr. Neerja Hajela, Secretary, Gut Microbiota and Probiotic Science Foundation (GMPSF, India) also lauded the event as very meaningful and pointed out that the performance of school students was very outstanding. She added that, GMPSF established on 9th November, 2011, works with an objective to create awareness and knowledge about gut microbiota and probiotics in the country, through symposia, seminars, books and collaborative research. Dr. Neerja also highlighted the influence of gut microbiota on human immunity and on our thinking process. Mr. Tomoyuki Iwama, Director -Production & Science, Yakult Danone India Pvt. Ltd. also attended the programme.

Dr. J.M. Dave, former Dean, Faculty of Dairy Science also endorsed that the benefits of probiotics need to be clinically proven through human trials. He also opined that probiotic is very



intricate and the benefits of consuming probiotic foods are influenced by many factors including age, intestinal microflora, food habits, etc. He also threw light on the contributions made by Department of Dairy Microbiology, SMC College of Dairy science in the field of probiotics.

Dr. A.A. Patel, Director of Extension Education in his presidential address stressed on the importance of probiotic food in the present scenario where consumers, especially



the adolescents are highly calorie conscious. He also spoke on various research activities of Anand Agricultural University including biofertilizers as well as on probiotic strains isolated by Dairy Microbiology Department. He appealed to the students to plant and nurture a tree to counter the dangers of climate change.

Gujarat State Biotechnology Mission (GSBTM), Govt. of Gujarat had organized a State level competition called "Biothon: Hackathon of Biotech Solutions for State Problem-2018". This was organized for motivating the scientific thinkers and innovators to come up with biotechnology-based solutions for state/community
